Margrét Pála Schools are unique for other reasons as well: the schools only use open ended material instead of traditional toys and positive discipline regarded as the best way to train social skills.

The Round Square Discovery Framework offers a structure that connects the IDEALS with twelve Discoveries that students explore on their learning journey: inquisitiveness, tenacity, courage, compassion, inventiveness, ability to solve problems, self-awareness, sense of responsibility, appreciation for diversity, commitment to sustainability, communication, and team-working skills.

Within this framework, students and faculty in member schools are encouraged to discover and develop their own capabilities through a range of experiences, activities, collaborative projects, and challenges, both in and beyond the curriculum, including international, regional, and local social service projects, exchanges, and conferences.
